## A BILL

  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "K2 Veterans Advocacy
- 5 Act of 2020".

1	SEC. 2. STUDY ON EXPOSURE BY MEMBERS OF THE ARMED
2	FORCES TO TOXICANTS AT KARSHI-
3	KHANABAD AIR BASE IN UZBEKISTAN.
4	(a) Agreement and Study.—Not later than 60
5	days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-
6	retary of Veterans Affairs shall enter into an agreement
7	with the Administrator of the Agency for Toxic Sub-
8	stances and Disease Registry for the Administrator to
9	complete, not later than two years after the date of the
10	enactment of this Act, a study to identify and assess any
11	causation or correlation between—
12	(1) exposure to toxicants at the Karshi-
13	Khanabad (K2) Air Base in Uzbekistan during the
14	period beginning on October 7, 2001, and ending on
15	November 21, 2005; and
16	(2) incidents of cancer and other diseases or ill-
17	nesses experienced by individuals who were members
18	of the Armed Forces during the period described in
19	paragraph (1) and exposed to toxicants as described
20	in such paragraph.
21	(b) Elements.—The study conducted under sub-
22	section (a) shall include the following:
23	(1) An assessment regarding the conditions of
24	Karshi-Khanabad Air Base, Uzbekistan, during the
25	period beginning on October 1, 2001, and ending on
26	December 31, 2005, including an identification of

- toxic substances contaminating the Air Base duringsuch period.
- 3 (2) An epidemiological study of the health con-4 sequences of individuals who were members of the 5 Armed Forces deployed to the Air Base during such 6 period.

## (c) Support for Study.—

- (1) In General.—The Secretary shall provide the Administrator with assistance in carrying out the study required by subsection (a), including by gathering such information as the Administrator may consider useful in carrying out the study, including environmental sampling data relative to any location included in the study.
- (2) Obtaining information concerning exposure.—Assistance under paragraph (1) provided by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall include compiling information on exposure described in subsection (a)(1) and any head of a Federal department or agency with information concerning such exposure, including the Secretary of Defense, shall provide the Secretary of Veterans Affairs with such information concerning such exposure as the Secretary of Veterans Affairs considers appropriate for purposes of the study required by subsection (a).

1	(d) Report.—
2	(1) In general.—Not later than two years
3	after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-
4	retary shall submit to the appropriate committees of
5	Congress a report on the matters covered by the
6	study completed under subsection (a).
7	(2) Contents.—The report required by para-
8	graph (1) shall include the following:
9	(A) The findings of the Administrator with
10	respect to the study completed under subsection
11	(a).
12	(B) A description of—
13	(i) the benefits administered by the
14	Secretary that a veteran may be eligible to
15	receive by reason of being exposed to toxic
16	substances at Karshi-Khanabad Air Base,
17	Uzbekistan, while serving in the Armed
18	Forces; and
19	(ii) the outreach conducted by the
20	Secretary to inform such veterans of such
21	benefits.
22	(3) Appropriate committees of congress
23	DEFINED.—In this subsection, the term "appro-
24	priate committees of Congress" means—

1	(A) the Committee on Veterans' Affairs
2	and the Committee on Armed Services of the
3	Senate; and
4	(B) the Committee on Veterans' Affairs
5	and the Committee on Armed Services of the
6	House of Representatives.
7	(e) Inclusion of Uzbekistan in Certain Reg-
8	ISTRIES AND PROGRAMS.—Section 201(c)(2) of the Dig-
9	nified Burial and Other Veterans' Benefits Improvement
10	Act of 2012 (Public Law 112–260; 38 U.S.C. 527 note)
11	is amended, in the matter preceding subparagraph (A),
12	by striking "Afghanistan or Iraq" and inserting "Afghani-
13	stan, Iraq, or Uzbekistan''.
